



In total 50 students have participated in the program this year. NSRI PRE-SEA TRAINING

The students first complete NSRI online training followed by a day long practical exercise at NSRI Simon's Town Station 10. For many of the students this day, where fears of the ocean are overcome, was a highlight of the year.


TERTIARY NEWS
