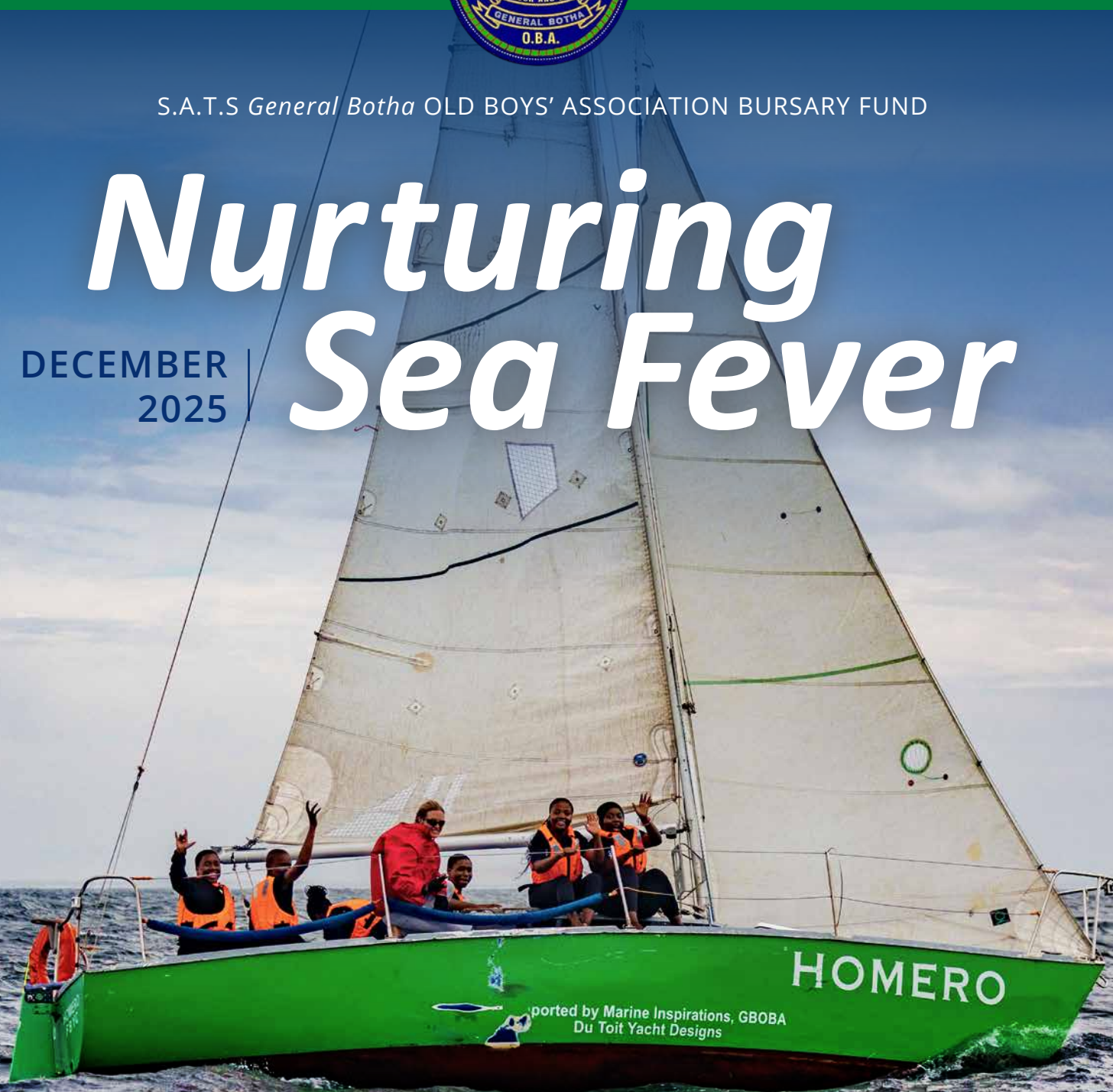

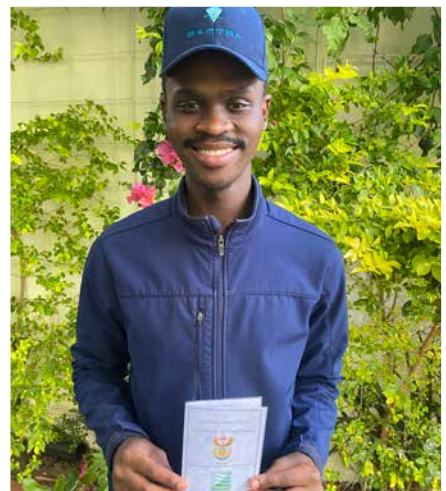
SBONGA SIBIYA
